The early trains brought hundreds of men and boys from all parts of this and the adjacent counties. Youths from 15 to 18 years of age were in great request. Wages ruled high being from £12 to £21 a year. Cows were a slender show perhaps owing to the numbers brought on the previous day. Lean stock was also below the average in quantity. Trade was brisk good beasts ranging from £15 to £16.10s and secondary from £12 to £14.10s per head.
